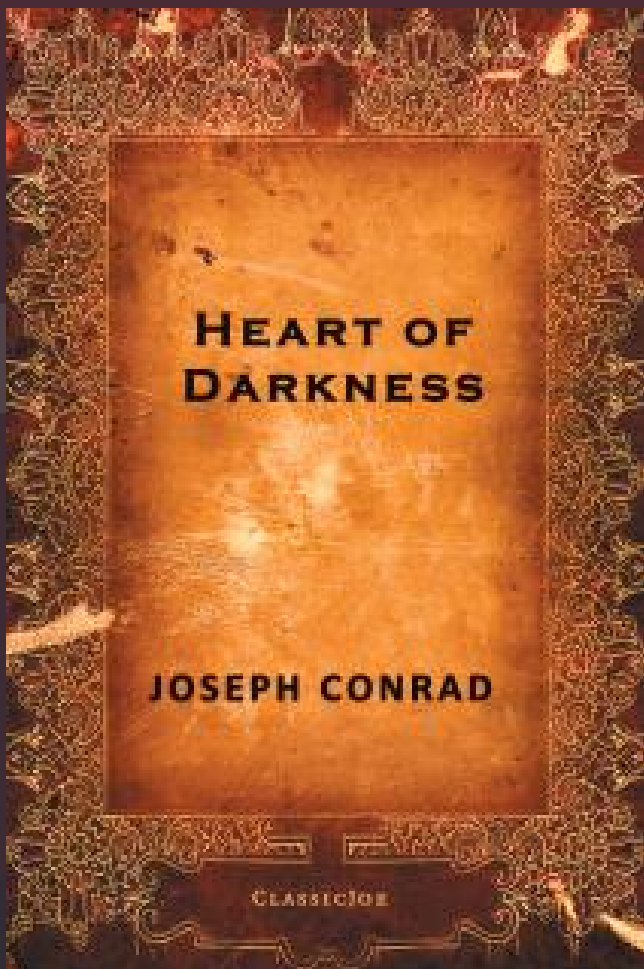
by Virginia Woolf

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HEART OF DARKNESS

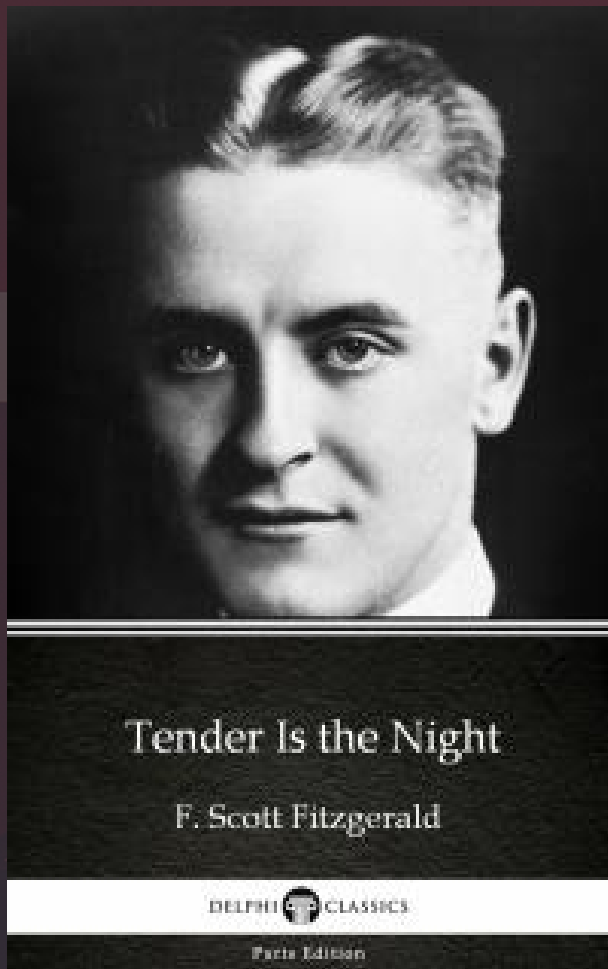
by Joseph Conrad

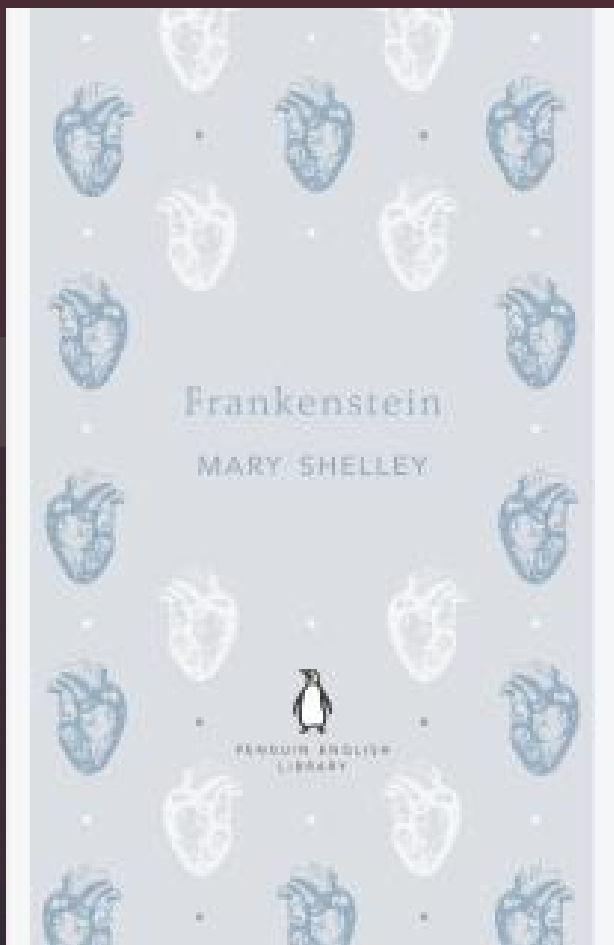
